

Jotaguard 630

Product description

This is a two component polyamine cured epoxy coating. It is a fast drying, surface tolerant, hard wearing, high solids, high build product. Specially designed for general use in cargo holds. Can be used as primer or finish coat in atmospheric and immersed environments. Suitable for properly prepared carbon steel and shop primed steel substrates. It can be applied at sub zero surface temperatures.

Discoloration may be observed after deballasting. This will however not affect the protective properties.

Typical use

Marine:

For general use in cargo holds and hatch coaming. The quick curing of the coating makes it suitable for short waiting time before taking first cargo. Can be used for cargo ballast holds.

Spray:	Use airless spray.
Brush:	Recommended for stripe coating and small areas. Care must be taken to achieve the specified dry film thickness.
Roller:	May be used for small areas. Not recommended for first primer coat. Care must be taken to achieve the specified dry film thickness.

Drying and curing times are determined under controlled temperatures and relative humidity below 85 %, and at average of the DFT range for the product.

NB: For this product the times for dried/cured for service is the minimum time before loading of the first cargo. For further advice please contact your local Jotun office.

Surface (touch) dry: The state of drying when slight pressure with a finger does not leave an imprint or reveal tackiness.

Walk-on-dry: Minimum time before the coating can tolerate normal foot traffic without permanent marks, imprints or other physical damage.

Dry to over coat, minimum: The recommended shortest time before the next coat can be applied.

Dried/cured for service: Minimum time before the coating can be permanently exposed to the intended environment/medium.

Heat resistance is influenced by the total coating system. If used as part of a system, ensure all coatings in the system have similar heat resistance.

Storage
